Historical Evolution

A conference from which emerged the "Tricontinental Organization for Solidarity with the Peoples" opened in Havana on 1 January 1966. Bringing together representatives of the revolutionary movements of Asia, Africa and Latin America, Palestinians, European intellectuals of the extreme left, most of whom were Trotskyites, and Soviet observers, this conference defined a new strategy of advanced subversion based on the internationalization of the struggle of all the revolutionary governments and organizations engaged in the destruction of capitalism and imperialism.

The coming to power of ALLENDE in Chile in 1970 restored a certain impetus to Latin American subversion of which Santiago de Chile became the reception center and center of operations. This same year in Argentina the "Revolutionary People's Army" [ERP] was established. It was the armed branch of the "Revolutionary Workers Party" [PRT], which established itself strongly in Tucuman Province.

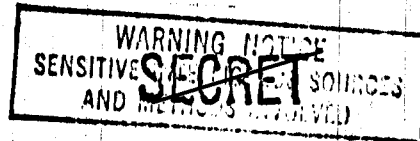

Because of this Argentina was rapidly invaded by the revolutionary organizations of the bordering countries: Chile, Bolivia, Uruguay, within which the Argentinian ERP took the directing role.

It was under these conditions that in February 1974, at the instigation of the Argentinian ERP and with the support of the LASO, the JCR was established in Mendoza, an organization claiming kinship with the Fourth Trotskyite International, represented during this meeting by Alain KRIVINE, and with the Cuban revolution represented by Arturo FERNANDEZ MARTINEZ and Benigno SOBERON, officials of the Cuban Ministry of the Interior.

Having the ambition to become starting from Argentina the center of the armed struggle for all Latin America, on the one hand the JCR developed its activities more and more openly and boldly in Argentine territory making Tucuman Province an inviolable fief. On the other hand it set up strong points abroad and especially in Europe.

Peron's death was to put an end to this situation, as the President's wife authorized the army to intervene before she resigned for the benefit of the present military regime.

In July 1976, the revolutionary rural front was practically liquidated,

the movements of local and foreign guerrillas broke up and were forced into exile. Their members emigrated mainly to Cuba, Mexico and Europe where a reception and action infrastructure had previously been set up.

While on the Latin American continent the armed struggle is limiting itself to urban guerrilla warfare more and more roughly treated, the J.A. is today making its main effort abroad where it is firmly established and where with the aid of local and international organizations, it is dealing hard blows to the governments in position by means of an especially effective propaganda.

Bases and doctrine of the JCR

The JCR was established in 1974 at Cuba's instigation.

The JCR receives suggestions often originating in Moscow in the person of Rodney ARISMENDI, secretary of the Uruguayan Communist Party, suggestions which are relayed by Cuba, but the direct orders never come from Moscow or Cuba, as the JCR is completely independent in its action on the Latin American continent with the exception of special missions on an international level. This same freedom of action is met with again within the JCR itself where each of the movements which constitute it has the power to make and implement decisions in its area of influence.

This freedom of action on the part of the JCR is nevertheless limited by the overall failure of the armed struggle on the Latin American continent, a failure which has induced it to depend more for its survival on Cuba which grants it material, ideological and financial aid.

In this spirit, the JCR, whose logistical base is Cuba, was established to intensify and coordinate the armed struggle on the Latin American continent with the mission of giving military structures to the liberation organizations and movements.

The JCR also claimed kinship with the Fourth Trotskyite International at the time of its establishment without however espousing all the theories

and directives of the Unified Secretariat in Brussels. There was even a rupture between the ERP and the Fourth International at the prompting of Mario SANTUCHO holding mainly against Brussels the failure to recognize in the Cuban and Vietnamese revolutionaries the vanguard of the international struggle of the proletariat. SANTUCHO's death smoothed out the differences and during its last congress in Paris, the JCR recommended a rapprochement with the Fourth International while demanding of the Unified Secretariat that it be allowed total autonomy for its operations in Latin America. This rapprochement found expression in deeds by placing at the JCR's disposal the Fourth International's clandestine apparatus to organize its meetings with other revolutionary movements. A Frenchman, Alain LABROUSSE, was in charge of liaisons between the JCR and the Fourth International.

The JCR endeavors to be the unifying factor in the Latin American struggle. Drawing from both Marxism-Leninism and the politico-revolutionary ideas of "Che" GUEVARA, it advocates the union of all the revolutionary forces of the continent in an armed struggle directed against imperialism, the economic monopolies, bourgeois nationalism, reformism. The JCR itself does not always reveal itself materially on the military and operational levels which, as in the past, are the province of the member organizations but in accordance with the Leninist doctrine which it claims as its authority, it tries to place the people's liberation armies under the direction of the proletarian combatant parties. Its basic strategy aimed at the necessity for a prolonged revolutionary war which would make of Latin America a new Vietnam.

As priority was given to Argentina and Chile, it had planned a twofold action conducted jointly in the interior and abroad:

Organization and functioning of the JCR

I - Composition

When it was established, the structure of the JCR was constituted by:

- Revolutionary People's Army [ERP], armed branch of the Argentinian Revolutionary Workers Party [PRT] led by Mario SANTUCHO, killed in 1976
- National Liberation Movement [MLN] Uruguyan Tupamaros led by Andres Felix CULTELLI CHIRIRAO
- National Liberation Army [ELN] of Bolivia led by Ruben SANCHEZ VALDIVIA
- Movement of the Revolutionary Left [MLR] of Chile led by Patricio Antonio BIEDMA.

The following groups were then affiliated more or less closely with this basic nucleus:

- Revolutionary Armed Vanguard [VAR] - Brazil
- Socialist Action Movement [MAS] - Brazil
- Paraguayan National Liberation Front [FREPALINA] - Paraguay
- Revolutionary Armed Front [FAR] - Guatemala
- The Montoneros (Argentina) led by Mario FIRMENICH and Roberto QUIETO
- Armed Front of National Liberation [FALN] - Venezuela
- Movement of the Revolutionary Left [MLR] - Peru
- National Liberation Army [ELN] - Colombia
- Sandinist Front - Nicaragua

II. Management and Organization

At least up to the seizure of power by the military in Argentina the ERP played a preponderant role within the JCR ^{with} ~~having~~ the general command in Buenos Aires and ^{with} ~~the~~ schools for cadre and logistical infrastructure in Tucuman Province.

Since its creation, faithful to the principles of internationalism of the struggle as laid down in Havana in 1966 and spelled out by IASO in 1967, the JCR established an international organization structured roughly as follows:

21. General Command and the Latin American Zone.

The working organ of the General Command is L'Equipe Internationale [International Team] through which pass all contacts between member organizations of the JCR both in and out of Latin America.

This team transmits orders and guidance from the general command furnishing the themes and data for propaganda activities and for ~~solidarity~~ unity among the cadre in the campaign conducted in favor of subversive organizations and against the existing governments. It is also responsible for the makeup ^{overseas} of the infrastructure ~~as~~ for receiving ^{Refugees}.

Its preferred interlocutor is the Argentine Center for Information and Solidarity ^(CAIS) located in Paris which is the the ^{turntable} ~~base~~ for communications in Europe and the USA.

Prime emphasis of the actions conceived by the international team is based on:

-actions of solidarity aimed at gaining the ideological sympathy of official international organizations in order to ~~have them~~ have them intervene on behalf of imprisoned revolutionary militants which.

The dismantlement of this international team in 1976x ~~which occurred in that the general command was disorganized~~ brought disorganization to the general command, the majority of whose hard core leaders sought refuge in Mexico and Cuba, and the temporary ~~in~~ interruption of liaison with the CAIS of Paris.

At the same time that the General Headquarters located itself in Cuba and Bogota, Paris saw its ~~international~~ international role grow.

After 1976 the Command of the JCR moved and lost some of its unity.

22. External (Foreign) Command

Since its formation, the JCR located itself in Europe to conduct an action complementary to the armed struggle, an action conceived and directed by the international team and carried out by a general secretariat based in Paris - which became functional in December 1974.

This general secretariat operates in various organizations of which the principle one is the Argentine Center for Information and Solidarity (CAIS) formed in March 1975 under the name of Group for Solidi

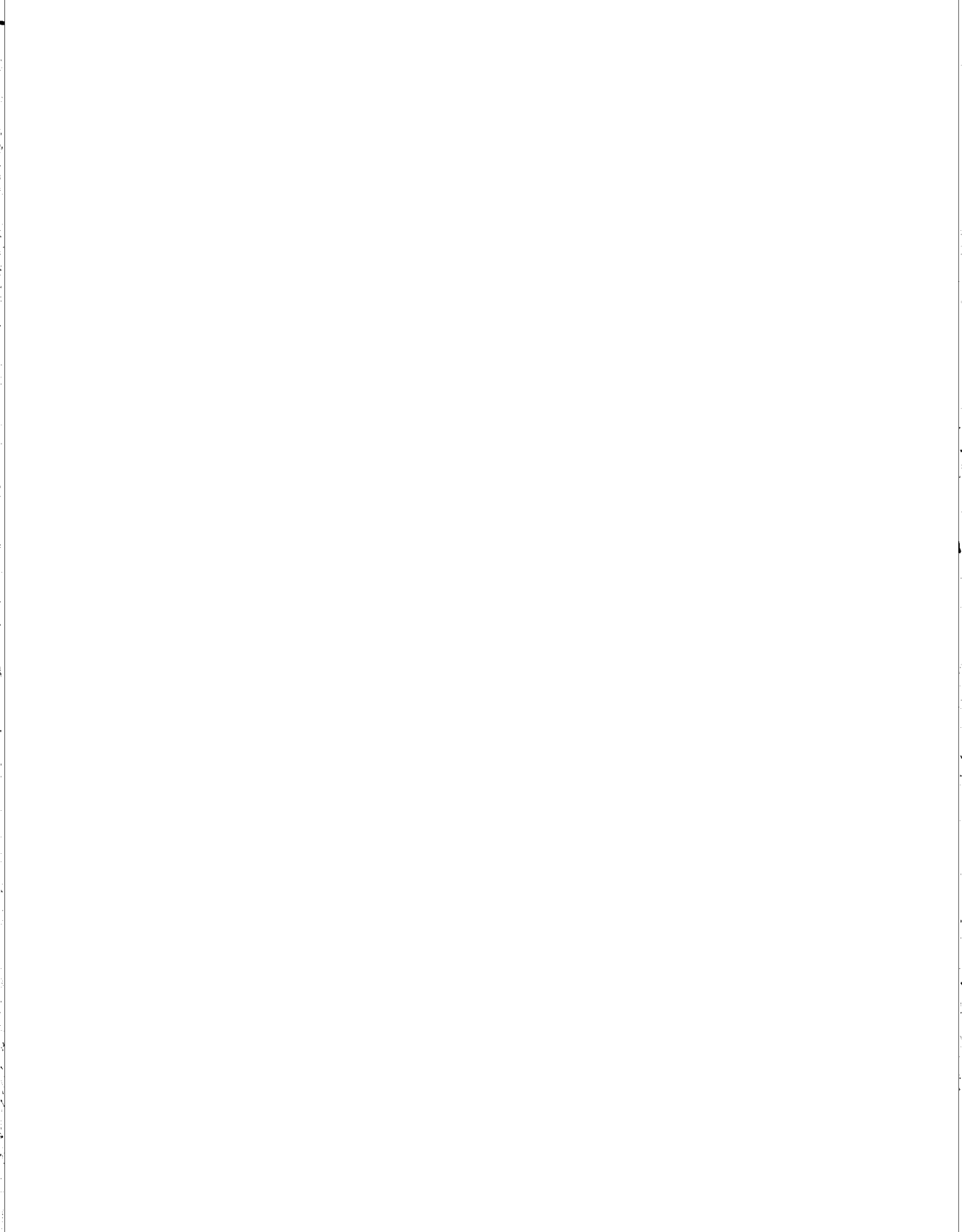

IV. Actions of the JCR

The armed struggle, the leadership of the masses and the ^{overthrow} ~~removal~~ of existing power with the aim of installing people's ~~own~~ socialist regimes are ~~the~~ priority objectives.

The seizure of power by military regimes, and the repression and annihilation of rural guerrillas have forced them to moderate their ambitions on the Latin American continent or to maintain only urban guerrilla activities which are less efficacious but often spectacular.

Being mostly exiled, the revolutionary leaders have moved their combat to the European continent, the most porous and the most permissive, where they have ~~reconstituted~~ reconstituted an essentially subversive apparatus which naturally has found a home on the ^European revolutionary fringe.

From Europe they mount a three-pronged action:

- reconstitution of networks
- creating organizations of solidarity and support
- Infiltration of international organizations in the frame of a campaign aimed at discrediting and isolating the existing governments.

Internal Connections of the JCR

The JCR, as it has been presented heretofore, appears from under the ERP, its Argentine mother-organization. The picture would be incomplete if the other [whose seats are in Paris,] Latin American movements, included in the JCR and with which the ERP works in close cooperation, are not introduced herein.

I - The Chilean MIR

Its installation and following in Europe preceded the establishment of ERP and JCR and it became a model and a mould for the latter two. In July 1976, 16,500 Chileans had left their country.

If it is not the product of LASO, the JCR is its continuation and an instrument of combat. On the armed struggle level the JCR receives from Cuba logistical training, financial and moral assistance; on the propaganda and subversive activities all the JCR European ~~branches~~ bureaus are in permanent contact with the local embassies which are delivering funds and assistance.

Alain KRIVINE participated at the inaugural of the JCR. At the very heart of the LCR there is a team which is specifically entrusted with contacts with Latin American revolutionaries. Under the impulse of Mario SANTUCHO a partial rupture took place between the ERP and the Fourth International, but after the death of SANTUCHO in 1976, a very open rapprochement took place among all movements participating in the JCR of PARIS and the LCR - the most active French branch of the Fourth International.

The LCR places at the disposal of the JCR its clandestine infrastructure in particular for the organization of meetings with the other revolutionary organizations, above all the Palestinian ones. Alain LABROUSSE is the liaison man between the JCR and the Fourth International.

Having replaced Vietnam as one of the worries of Western intelligentsia, the JCR managed to built ^{from} ~~an~~ itself an image of ~~strength~~ strength abroad while surviving painfully in the Latin American continent.

For the time being the JCR elements are waging ~~an international struggle~~ in Europe a struggle limited to propaganda and political ~~struggle~~ action. However, on the basis of its moulding and connections with the most extreme revolutionary movement the JCR is compelled, whether by need or solidarity, to engage in violent ^{..} actions on European territory where it has received a particularly liberal welcome.
